If you have been hitting up the digital side of the BMX revolution in NJ then you know that what was once deemed impossible has occurred in NJ.

The ABA has returned and Bill "The 800 lb. Gorilla" Hayden is involved. I say involved because the actual track operator is Diane Hayden, his wife. It should also be noted that Diane was is a hardcore BMXer as well. Speaking with Bill these past few years was real refreshing as here was a guy who has many years of experience in the racing and trail riding side of the sport. Bill seemed to be a perfect candidate for someone to get a track going, and one of the things we talked a lot about was getting something going in North NJ. There hasn't been anything going near that neck of the woods since about 1999 when Secaucus was located up by the meadowlands.

Bill was helping out at Flemington for awhile, doing track changes and the like, but really wanted to reignite the NJ BMX scene like it was back in the older guys heydays, the mid to late 80's. One of the early guys to sign up at brokenspokes net, Bill was always willing to speak his mind on the forum portion of the site. It was this outspoken, go for it attitude that was nurtured during the early days of racing that convinced him and his wife that it was time to make it happen for northern NJ and get a new track up.

People will ask, why ABA?

Back in our time, (our meaning guys like me, Craig, Kapigian, Legend, Bill, Farside...etc.) the ABA was all over NJ. When I say all over I mean like 12-18 tracks all over. We had FOUR what are called districts...what is a district? A district was a division in the state created when you got over 500 riders in an area. So, um, do the math there. Yea it was pretty hectic back in our day. Your district plate was able to be run anywhere in the country, you got a 4' tall trophy for number 1, top 10 got trophies, 11 to 50 got medals. We got letters and deals from companies in BMX. It was a BIG DEAL to be top in your district.

Oh, that's like the NBL regional thing. No, it's not. The NBL requires you to race their "regional championship", the ABA just required you to race and win. Is the ABA the godsend to NJ BMX. No, but finally there is an alternative to racing BMX in NJ again that is run by a rider who only cares about bringing in new riders to the sport. Bill gets all the big issues, clips, too many nationals, expense of racing, the whole thing. Being with the ABA means he can do what he wants.

And you know what? NJBMX Szine and brokenspokes net will be there to cover his stuff, just like we do for the NBL in NJ. When Bill makes a boo boo, (he will, we all do, LOL) he will catch the big shooter for it, but in seeing how he has been on the site, he will listen and make changes. His wife has already committed to taking the time to just go out and promote the track.

These people love BMX. No ego trips about their kids racing or how well they do at nationals, they truly understand the Mannino philosophy of "it's all about some kids and a pile of dirt".

With the opening of Diane and Bill's track up north, the practice track coming in Lumberton and the talk of another free-ride track coming in Edison, things are looking to pop for the BMXers in NJ once again. NJBMX Szine and brokenspokes.net will be there to cover what they can and look for the people who are doing right by the only thing that matters,

















One More Time
